Located on the cemetery's highest point (229.5 feet above sea level, 25 feet higher than the Rucker pyramid)

RUCKER MAUSOLEUM: A 30-FOOT GRANITE PYRAMID *Block 19*

Thirty feet square, thirty feet tall on a stone-encased earthen plinth. Designed and constructed of Washington granite by F W Ladd of Seattle at a cost of \$30,000. Four-by-seven-foot door of Red Beach granite from Maine. Chapel space inside nine feet square and twelve feet tall, surmounted by a five foot tall dome with four art glass windows and, at one time, a gas chandelier. There are 22 crypts, each two by two-and-a-half feet and seven-feet-four inches deep.

The fitted closures for the crypts are of polished Barre granite from Vermont. A large, seated bronze figure representing Jane Rucker once stood atop the doorway. 204.5 feet above sea level, seventy feet higher than the lych-gate at the northeast corner of the cemetery. Location: N 47° 57.792 x W 122° 12.203. Interred here are Jane Morris Rucker (1830-1907) and her sons Wyatt J Rucker (1857-1931) (a 32nd Degree Mason, entombed after full Rose Croix Masonic service at Scottish Rites Temple) and Bethel J Rucker (1862-1945)

ENTRANCE LYCH-GATE (lych or lich: archaic term for corpse) *ne cor of 1,6*

This gazebo-like building imitates the traditional English churchyard structure where pallbearers rest the coffin and await the arrival of the minister. Rebuilt 2004-05 after extensive damage by a tree blown down in a windstorm.

1995 LOCATION SHOOT FOR "ASSASSINS"

A Warner Brothers film with Sylvester Stallone & Antonio Banderas, produced & directed by Richard Donner (*The Omen*, *Superman*, *Lethal Weapon*), with cinematography by Vilmos Zsigmond (*Deliverance*, *Cinderella Liberty*, *The Deer Hunter*). Production notes for the DVD release comment on the importance of the locations selected for the film and mention the "elegant cemetery" at Everett, WA. The Evergreen Cemetery sequence occurs about nine minutes into the film and lasts about five and a half minutes.

Concrete circle on hillside east of Rucker tomb. The funeral service takes place inside a fountain circle which was removed in 2005.

Buse monument on ridge east of Rucker tomb. Rival assassin Miguel Bain (Antonio Banderas) fires fatal shots at mobster from behind Buse tombstone. Moss was applied to obscure the name.

Swalwell monument & steps on ridge east of Rucker tomb. Hitman Robert Rath (Sylvester Stallone) pursues his nemesis Miguel Bain (Banderas) up the hillside past the Swalwell plot. A publicity still for the film shows the Swalwell steps behind Stallone.

Gunn monument near large maple, hillside southeast of Rucker tomb. Stallone takes cover behind the Amos Gunn monument, exchanging fire with Banderas from this position.

Large fir tree southeast of Rucker tomb. Banderas briefly takes cover behind this large evergreen as he is pursued through the cemetery.

Fake "RHODES" obelisk, temporarily installed by film crew southeast of Rucker tomb. Banderas ducks behind this artificial monument, exchanging fire with Stallone and the police just before he is captured. Morgan Rhodes is the name of a Seattle woman who was a production assistant on the film

Northeast entrance to cemetery. Stallone returns to his parked car, a grey Ford Taurus, and impatiently attempts to exit in pursuit of Banderas, who is in police custody.

Magic overpass. Stallone races out of the cemetery, crossing the overpass east of the cemetery entrance and heading north onto Broadway. Oddly enough, the next shot shows him in Seattle, 25 miles in the opposite direction.
