EVERETT, WA – Want to write a novel? Join Everett Public Library for a series of events during National Novel Writing Month, aka [NaNoWriMo](#). This worldwide challenge encourages participants to spend the month of November writing the first draft of a novel. The goal: 50,000 words.

Everett Public Library is hosting five NaNo prep and writing events during October and November:
